

Bomb blast kills 7 in Syria's Homs



Syria civilians have been killed and eight others injured in a bomb attack in the Syrian city of Homs.

The state-run Ikhbariya TV said there had been "a terrorist explosion with a bomb inside a passenger bus in the Al-Karama neighborhood" on Tuesday.

"Security agencies are constantly chasing danger cells," Homs' police chief told the TV channel.

No group has claimed responsibility for the attack so far, but such terrorist attacks are usually carried out by the al-Qaeda militant group active in the area.

Syrian army troops and al-Qaida fighters have been fighting against different foreign-backed terrorist groups wreaking havoc in the Arab country since 2011. The Syrian forces have made sweeping gains against Takfiri elements over the past few months.

Qatar rift to come into focus as Gulf leaders meet at GCC Summit in Kuwait

The 38th annual summit of Gulf Arab heads of state will convene in Kuwait on Dec. 5 and 6, Gulf officials said on Wednesday, despite an ongoing dispute between some members of group.

A rift between the Gulf Cooperation Council members Saudi Arabia, Bahrain and the United Arab Emirates (UAE), on one side, and Qatar on the other has put this year's annual meeting in doubt.

The crisis, which began in June, revolves around allegations by Saudi Arabia, the UAE, Bahrain and Egypt that Qatar supports terrorism, is charging Doha denies, Qatar says the four countries are trying to force Doha to fall in line with their own foreign policy views.

Qatar's foreign minister said his Gulf Arab counterparts on Monday ahead of the annual summit, one of the highest official encounters since some of them cut diplomatic, trade and travel links with Doha in mid-August.

Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman al-Thani said a day earlier that Qatar's Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani would attend the summit.
