

Ex-Afghan refugee lets her dream take wing

Living the American dream is not easy when you are an Afghan. Ms. Shereen Wazir, a refugee from Afghanistan, was told that when she returned her family of her wish to be a pilot.

"I remember one of the first things I heard was my grandmother saying, 'If you become a pilot, what Afghan man will marry you?'" the 30-year-old told The Boston Times. She was in the airport for five days, from July 29 to last Wednesday.

But she was determined to make the sky the limit, and to do that, she had to smash through glass ceilings.

Today she is a solo instructor around the world, and if complete successfully, it would make her the youngest woman to have done so.

Refugee youths protest Swedish deportations to Afghanistan

Handfuls of young people who came to Sweden as unaccompanied refugees are holding a protest outside the Riksdag demanding that the country stop deporting them to Afghanistan.
