

## Russia, Turkey, Iran to discuss Syria safe zones in Tehran: Lavrov

Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov says Russia, Turkey and Iran will discuss the situation with the participation of UN Security Council members in a meeting in Tehran on August 8-9. Lavrov said Sunday.

Turkey, which backs anti-Damascus militant groups, seeks to find a mechanism to eliminate the army by the end of August. More than 2.5 million people are believed to be living in the general area of the four zones which span the southern provinces of Daraa, Qunayra and Sweida.

The rest of the areas cover the north-western province of Idlib, parts of the central governor of Hama, and the militant-controlled Eastern Ghouta Province near Damascus.

Russia, which backs UN-backed forces, agreed to resume the next round of Syria peace talks in Astana in late August.
