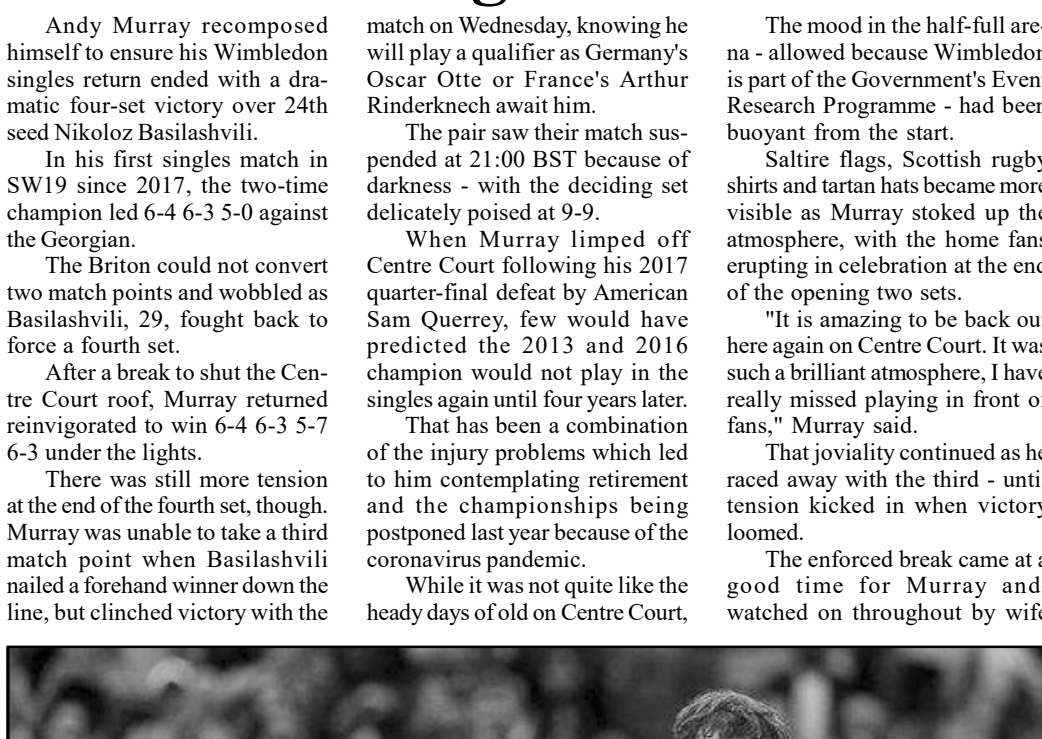

The Briton could not convert two match points and walked to his defeat, but he would have won a fourth set.

After a break over the Centre Court roof, Murray returned to court to win 4-2, 3-7, 6-4 under the lights.
