Seyyed Ebrahim Raeisi has won Iran's 2021 presidential election by a landslide, according to preliminary results by the Interior Ministry. Raeisi, 78, won 82.01 percent of the vote, with around 90% of the votes counted so far.

Raeisi is associated with the Islamic Revolution, but he said he ran in the election this year as an independent when he announced his presidential bid last month. He was competing with the cleric Hossein Rouhani, who won the 2013 election, and the cleric Hassan Rouhani, who won the 2017 election.
